

## Zoom Effect

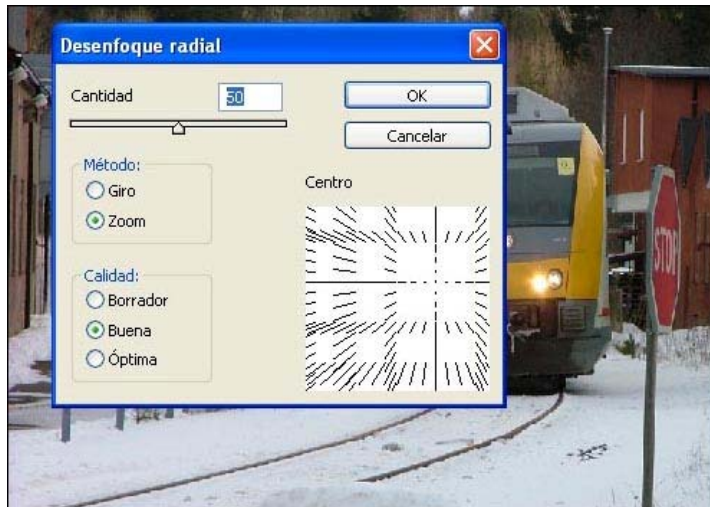
This is a tip similar to the Selective Focus, which uses the “Layers” of the Photoshop to make a different effect.

You can simulate a picture taken with a zoom lens, when you move the focal length while you are taking the picture. Do the following steps:

- 1) Choose an image which would be better with a “Zoom effect”



- 2) Make a copy of the image with “Layer > Duplicate Layer”
- 3) Blur the copy layer with “Filter > Blur > Radial Blur” and choose the “Zoom” option. Set the degree of blur you like and the center point.



- 4) The effect should be similar to this picture.



- 5) With the erase tool at 100%, and with a very soft brush, erase the zone you want with focus. You will see how the erased zone will let you see the underneath layer which is in focus



- 6) Make only one image layer with "Layers > Flatten Image"
- 7) Save your work with another file name not to lose your original image.
